

ABOUT THE PROJECT

Maritime profession, due to the diversity of risks involved and harshness of working conditions at sea, is acknowledged to be among one of the most dangerous professions in the world. Providing emergency medical treatment on-board ships at sea can be difficult due to the limited available medical resources and competence of onboard medical personnel. Maintaining optimum medical conditions for seafarers can be directly effective in preventing risks related to safer navigation at sea The project aims at defining knowledge gaps of health professionals and determining potential requirements medical of training. In order to enhance medical ability the of seafarers and maritime doctors, three key distance

learning modules will be developed MariHEALTH in project to train seafarers (officers and ratings) and maritime doctors. The project will provide elementary first aid distance training program for ratings and advance medical distance training program for officers to improve their first skills and aid medical knowledge as well as keeping them up to date. The maritime doctors will be trained to enhance for the health awareness risks of seafarers and also to familiarization increase associated with the shipboard working environment. At the end of the project, besides training modules for seafarers and maritime doctors, a mobile phone application of MariHEALTH (app) training

platform will also be created to enable easy accessibility for seafarers, maritime doctors, and maritime professionals.
